THE WHAT: CASEL 5 areas of competence

Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL)

Recognizing one's own emotions and values as well as one's strengths and challenges

Showing understanding and empathy for others



Managing emotions and behaviors to achieve one's goals

Making ethical, constructive choices about personal and social behavior

Forming positive relationships, working in teams, dealing effectively with conflict

SEL for Personal and Academic Success

Findings	Descriptions
	Achievement scores an average of 11 percentile points higher than students who did not receive SEL instruction.
and behaviors	Greater motivation to learn, deeper commitment to school, increased time devoted to school work, better classroom behavior.
_	Decrease disruptive class behavior, noncompliance, aggression, delinquent acts, disciplinary referrals.
	Fewer reports of student depression, anxiety, stress, and social withdrawal.

Program Structure

Monday - Weekly Check-In

Starting and ending the week with advisory Check-Ins and Check-Outs allows advisors and students to build personal relationships in a simple, safe way and hear a bit about each other's lives outside of school.

Tuesday - Class Challenge

Class Challenges give students a chance to form strong, positive bonds with each other and can be a fun way to help lay the groundwork for the week's Second Step® lesson.

Wednesday - Weekly Topic Lesson

Thursday - Class Meeting

Class Meetings help build a sense of community within advisory, give students a chance to explore and reflect on Second Step® skills and concepts in a safe space, and provide a forum for students to think about applying the skills they're learning to social and academic situations

Character Strong (Grades 9-12)

High School SEL Program:

The newly revised version of the Character Strong Secondary Social & Emotional Learning program was developed based on research in Social & Emotional Learning, psychology, education, and adolescent development. Our approach to creating this program was to start with the foundational SEL competencies such as:

- Self-management
- Responsible decision-making
- Relationship skills
- Social-awareness
- Self-awareness

Program Structure

Classroom Delivery Grades 9-12

- 25 lessons per grade level
- Lessons include introduction, activity, and closing event (20-25 minute lessons)
- Lessons are presented in order as the sequence and structure is evidence based
- English Department will implement SEL
 Character Strong lessons 2x per month
 this school year beginning in January
 2022
- The goal for next school year is to implement all 25 lessons per grade level

Program Goals/Future Plans

Program Goals

- -Students will develop emotional understanding
- -Student will develop empathy skills
- -Students will develop leadership skills
- -Students will develop the ability to set goals and take steps to achieve those goals
- -Students will develop an understanding of their values
- -Students will learn self management skills, responsible decision making skills, social and self-awareness skills, and relational skills

Future Plans

- -September 2022, SEL lessons will be delivered 2-3x per month to total 25 lessons per year per grade level
- -Monthly Newsletter/Calendar to all high school staff about implementation and lessons taught
- -Teacher collaboration and co-teaching lessons across disciplines

Summary: Overall Goals of SEL/Character Ed Programming

We are focusing on the competencies listed below through our SEL/CE programming for students to prepare for post secondary planning. According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) Career Ready Competencies (NACE, 2018), these areas are most important. This information can also be found on Page 12 of the NYSED Social Emotional Learning: A Guide to Systemic Whole School Implementation.

- Critical thinking/ problem solving: Exercise sound reasoning to analyze issues, make decisions, and overcome problems.
- Teamwork/ collaboration: Build collaborative relationships with peers and adults. Ability to work within a team structure and negotiate and manage conflict.
- Oral/written communication: Articulate thoughts and ideas clearly and effectively in written and oral forms to persons inside and outside of the organization.
- Global/intercultural fluency: Demonstrate openness, inclusiveness, sensitivity, and the ability to interact respectfully with all people and understand individuals' differences.

 relevant to the position desired and career goals and identify areas necessary for professional
 growth.
- Digital technology: Leverage existing digital technologies ethically and efficiently to solve problems, complete tasks, and accomplish goals. Demonstrate effective adaptability to new and emerging technologies.
